

Martin Ortiz was born on July 29th, 1924 in Edinburg, Texas. His family "followed the crops" as he said, migrating west. Eventually the military brought him to California. He joined the Army and was assigned to the 106th Calvary Regiment from 1943 to 1945.

BACK TO SCHOOL AT THE HIVE

The HIVE is Alive!

One day a few months ago, the exalted ruler, Jeff Brumett, asked if I would go with him to check out an after-school program. It was here in Santa Ana and was being run by an old friend of his that he knew back at Foothill High School. He thought it might be an opportunity for the Monday Night Football committee and the lodge to provide some assistance. His friend had invited him to visit and see for himself. Of course, I couldn't pass up the opportunity.

ER Jeff and I met with Laura Caraccio, director of the HIVE and long-time friend. The HIVE, located at 1510 N. Parton Street in Santa Ana, is part of the 112-year-old St Peter's Lutheran Church. Graciously, the church worked with Laura for an agreement to rent much of its classroom and outdoor space so the HIVE could provide assistance to children living in the surrounding neighborhood.

Upon meeting with Laura, there was no doubt how much she loves what she's doing and cares deeply about the kids in the program. Laura grew her love of giving early in life and learned invaluable lessons and examples of serving from one of the most highly regarded individuals in the entire world, Mother Teresa. In her early twenties, Laura traveled to Calcutta, India where she volunteered in Mother Teresa's homes and credits this experience with providing much of the inspiration for the HIVE Youth Program. Laura would see Mother Teresa daily and remembers her saying, "We do ordinary things with great love".



During our visit to the HIVE, we saw ordinary things taking place: homework, snacks, some play time. There was an aura of belonging and enjoyment being around each other. As Laura told us, "Our deeper mission is to create a space where children and youth are seen, valued and loved for who they are". It was clear that deeper mission was being felt.

The children at the HIVE program come from various backgrounds and experiences. Some have experienced trauma at a young age, while others live in challenging neighborhoods and households. Lessons learned from Mother Teresa help guide Laura and her volunteers to provide an atmosphere of trust, positivity and healthy relationships. "I believe this is what is most needed for a child to develop a healthy sense of self, and to heal from the impact of trauma", said Laura.

The HIVE has five core values: courtesy, integrity, perseverance, self-control, and indomitable spirit. Ask any child there and they will proudly recite them for you. It appeared all these kids have embraced the program and what it is all about. Love is at the heart of the HIVE... love for each child, youth, parent, volunteer.
When an individual knows they are loved and capable of loving, anything is possible."

You can tell they are happy to be there and appreciate having a place like that for them to go to. Which is why our exalted ruler, Jeff, wanted to help, not just for his high school buddy Laura, but also for all these beautiful souls figuring out life on a day-to-day basis.

On behalf of the children of the HIVE Youth Program, Laura extends a grateful thank you to all who donated both financially and with goods, to help their program continue. The program is run strictly on a voluntary basis, and has relied on a small group of donors to meet their basic needs. They will continue to need support in the future. The Monday Night Football Committee, on behalf of our lodge, thanks the members who donated goods and supplies. Also, kudos to the Linda Fernandez Backpack Project which donated backpacks for the kids at the HIVE. We look forward to continuing to help whenever possible going forward.

Funding for this scholarship is provided by donations from the Santa Ana Elks #794 members.

The Santa Ana Elks 794 Scholarship was established in 2011, made possible due to contributions from members and friends of the Santa Ana Elks Lodge #794 and from memorial donations.

Lastly, the athletic scholarship was created and sponsored by the Santa Ana Elks Lodge #794, Monday Night Football Committee in 2022. Three Generations of Santa Ana Elks

One of the reasons I like to be at initiation is to meet and greet our newest members. In addition to making them feel welcome and engaged, you never know what you'll learn about someone. At our July 25 initiation, I introduced myself to a guy by the name of Brian Pope. Brian was very excited to join our lodge and during his introduction, he stated he is a third-generation Santa Ana Elk.

Brian's father and grandfather had similar lives and career paths. Frank Sr., Brian's grandfather, was in real estate. He was the first ever East Orange County Board of Realtors president around 1910. He was very active in the civic community as well being friends with other early OC people of interest like James Irvine, with whom he often played poker. He joined our lodge in the early 1900's and was a lifelong member. Brian's dad, Frank Jr., was also a real estate broker. He too was very active civically. He joined 794 around 1960 and frequented the lodge for business lunches and functions. Both men were veterans: Frank Jr. joined the Air Force after the bombing of Hiroshima and Frank Sr. joined the Army when he was about 17 years old. This is where it gets interesting.

Frank Sr. was born in Missouri in 1878. When he heard about Lt. Colonel Teddy Roosevelt forming his Rough Riders, he applied to join the Army and was determined to join, being a fellow Missourian. Roosevelt personally interviewed every applicant. Frank Sr. was eventually assigned to Tampa, Florida with the Rough Riders due to the Spanish-American War that was going on in Cuba. Americans typically relate the Rough Riders with the Battle of San Juan Hill in Cuba, and this is why they were sent to Florida. Equipped with bull whips, rifles, and horses they were a quite a force and helped the people of Cuba gain their freedom from Spain.

Although not an Elk, Brian's father-in-law, Nativad "Nat" Vaca, was also a veteran and survivor of the Battle of the Bulge. He received the Bronze Star and Purple Heart during his military service. You'll find a picture of him and others on the wall in a local Mexican restaurant here in Santa Ana, The La Chiquita. So, Brian has a deep connection to veterans from all sides of his family.

Brian was born here in Santa

Ana in 1956 and has lived in Santa Ana his entire life. He had three brothers, all older than him, and one sister who is married to Bill Hill, retired sergeant with the Santa Ana P.D. Brian went to Santa Ana High School where he was a very good athlete. Brian currently is an electrical sales engineer and is now semiretired. He has been married to Audrey for 43 years and they have two sons and two grandchildren.

Brian also shared, when doing his family history, that his lineage goes all the way back to Mount Vernon of George Washington days. His great-great-grandmother's name was Mary Pope. Mount Vernon was originally called Pope Creek. He hasn't confirmed it yet, but maybe, just maybe he's related to our first President! Brian also had a greatgreat-uncle, General John Pope, who fought in the Civil War. He was in a battle against Stonewall Jackson and Robert E Lee. He was on the inaugural train ride for President Lincoln in 1861 traveling from Springfield, Illinois to Washington, D.C.

Remember, you never know who you'll meet or what their story might be unless you just go up to them and introduce yourself! Welcome to your Elk family, Brian!






