

They also help mothers establish a means of support for themselves and their children, develop and adhere to a budget, learn parenting skills, locate affordable housing and save for future living expenses.

There were six of us who went to the Sheepfold: Ida Wade the chairman of the project and her daughter, Aubrey Wade, Sharon Casares, Maria Paulin, Linda Fernandez and our First Lady, Sheila Rodriguez.

When you come into the lodge, check out the pretty pink tree in the lobby. It is for our adopted family. The way it works is you take a tag off the tree (each tag lists a requested gift) and then bring that

The holidays are a time of reflection, gratitude and connection with family and friends. This emotional atmosphere often extends to a broader sense of compassion and a desire to help others. This is especially true at the lodge, because, truly, Elks care and Elks Share.

A great example of this is our leading knight, Mark Schauwecker, who has accepted the California Hawaii Elks Major Project challenge to increase the monies raised for our Purple Pig to better fulfill our major project goal.

The Purple Pig or California Elks Major Project funds 32 paid therapists and

preschool vision screeners to help disabled children when no other organizations can or will. These professional therapists and preschool vision screeners travel, sometimes great distances, to help children get care they need.

Further, many times the children will have tests, e.g. vision screening, that catches early signs of amblyopia ("Lazy Eye"), a medical problem that, once caught, can be corrected early on and save a child from going blind, quite literally.

This challenge started November 1, 2024 and continues until January 31, 2025 with several opportunities for our Elk members to help raise funds.

Let's begin by saving a few dates in your calendars: January 14, 2025 is Wahoo's Taco Night. It is the first widespread Purple Pig fundraiser of 2025 with proceeds from your meal helping to raise funds for the Purple Pig and



our Leading Knight's Challenge. Remember to mention Santa Ana Lodge #794 when you place your order! Flyers and locations for this event will be coming soon.

Next, on January 24, 2025, Santa Ana Lodge will be hosting our own fundraiser for Percy, our Purple Pig! Our wonderful DJ Ronnie will be spinning your favorite dance tunes and really knows how to get people on the dance floor! You will definitely see me on the dance floor because by now, everybody should know how much I love, love to dance!

What's In A Number?

Santa Ana Elks Lodge #794. That's us! A lot of you probably know, but recently I had a member asked me how an Elks lodge gets its number? As you may know, the Elks started all the way back on February 16, 1868, Charles Vance led the way to forming our first Elks Lodge in New York City. Oddly enough, Vance never took the obligation and technically never became an Elk himself. Due to some disagreements on several topics, he was voted out of leadership and never had the chance to join the lodge.

Three years later, Lodge #2 was formed in Philadelphia on February 19, 1871. Today the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks has over 2, 100 lodges in the United States and its territories. We have lodges in Guam, Puerto Rico, the Philippines and the Panama Canal believe it or not! Pretty impressive being we started out as a social club where members played a game with a cork to see who bought the next round, to what and who we are today.

To answer the question about we all got our lodge numbers, it's quite simple. When your lodge

was born, it assigned the next number in the order of those previously chartered. Hence, we are the 794th lodge to be formed and chartered.

Below are the top ten lodges originally formed. Sadly, not all are still around today. As you can see, California was involved very early in the growth of our order. For a current listing of all the lodges, you can go to www.elks.org. There you will find a complete list of lodges, history or the organization and lots of fun information, that if you play trivia on Wednesday nights here at the lodge, might come in handy! And remember on your travels, your membership card gets you in to every lodge around the country. Take advantage of that perk when visiting another city!


