### **Santa Ana Elks Ritual Team Shines!**

For those of you who don't know what ritual is, and you're a member, it's the ceremony you went through called initiation. Every year almost every officer team in the country, competes in their district to see which team performs it the best. That sounds like no big deal but ask any of the officers that competed, and they could tell you about all the hours they worked at memorizing their parts, learning how to turn their heads, stand, sit...it's one of the biggest time and effort commitments your officers take on. Not just going to weekly if not more often, practices as a team, but on their own time, rehearsing their lines.

All of that to lead up to the "Ritual Weekend", which was held here at our lodge back on the last weekend of April. The eight lodges in our district, Buena Park, Fullerton, Garden Grove, Huntington Beach, Mission Viejo, Newport Harbor, Orange, and Santa Ana all gathered here to see if their hard work paid off. Even though the perennial favorite, Garden Grove took home 1st place for

their team, your very own Santa Ana team took second place! We gave Garden Grove a scare and served notice that our team is on the rise and committed to one year dethroning the champs.

There is not only a team championship involved here. The individual officers can win their own titles. There are also a few additional categories that exalted rulers and past exalted rulers can compete in. The leading knight competes in the 11 O'clock Toast competition, exalted rulers and past exalted rulers compete in the Flag ceremony and another 11 O'clock Toast competition. Then lastly, there is the Most Improved Lodge. Here's the rundown of how we did individually, that took us to a second-place team finish:

We had two that finished first in their respective roles with our inner guard, Ronnie Harrell and esquire, George Will both took home first place finishes. Brian Byrd, our lecturing knight took home second place and Mark Schauwecker, our leading knight finished third. As a team we also won Most Improved, which means we had the highest increase in our team score this year, over last year. It was only six points too, so that was a tight score for all the lodges.

Our chaplain, Garlin Flynn, by score, finished second, however, as a repeating officer (meaning she's done this before), she was not eligible for an individual award. Her score still counted towards our team total which also was huge in our finishing second. Eli Morales, our loyal knight, had the dubious honor of having to compete in the toughest category this year. His score was one of the highest on our team overall, but he still finished .003 out of third place and was only .31 out of first place.

The other key role in our ritual team is the candidate. Their score also contributes to the team score and this year Colleen Daddario stepped up and into the role of the candidate. She did a fantastic job and was a key part of the team. The coaches were right there with them too, every step of the way, and a big thank you goes out to them as well for their efforts. Dave York, Buck Kuhns, Dan Breece and Sue McKee guided the team on their journey this year.

Although not everyone on the team won an award, the team effort led by our exalted ruler, Joe Rodriguez, sacrificed their personal time, put in the effort needed to earn an impressive second place finish in the Ritual Competition. When you see them, be sure and congratulate them on a job well done. Keep an eye out next year to come out and be a part of the weekend, to support your team and just as importantly, have fun at the tailgate on Sunday!

### It's Linda Fernandez Backpack Project Season!

It's June, school's about to let out for summer and that means it's time to heat up the drive to fund the Linda Fernandez Backpack Project! This will be Linda's 21st year funding backpacks for local school children. When she started, it was with only 25 backpacks. Since then, we've increased that number one hundred fold!

When Linda started, she would order supplies from Dollar Days and then drive all over Orange, Riverside and San Bernardino Counties to take advantage of "buy one, get one" sales on school backpacks. She'd then stuff them around her dining room table. It wasn't long until she was recognized as The Backpack Lady!

Well now, she's our Backpack Queen! And there's no table or dining room big enough to hold the thousands of backpacks!

In 2023, our goal was \$30,000, but Elks exceeded all expectations raising \$36,208. That's enough to fund 2,500 backpacks! But that still wasn't enough to fulfill the demand. We received requests from local organizations for 2,619 backpacks. So this year, we're aiming to raise even more and help all the kids in the Santa Ana, Tustin and Irvine that need our help! And Santa Ana Mayor Valerie Amezcua has asked for backpacks for the Back To School Community Resource Fair on July 28. In 2024, the need is bigger than ever!

Linda has now started a backpack committee because this project has grown beyond what a few people can do. It truly now takes a village and we invite you to be a part of it. Currently, there is a need for people to send thank you letters with tax ID to the donors. And, of course, we always need volunteers to sort and stuff the school supplies into the backpacks.



We've reserved the lodge ball-room for July 9 through 11 for backpack stuffing. Please put those dates on your calendar and plan on coming to help. And there are other ways to help as well. For a spouse, family member or caretaker, it means recognizing when the veteran is struggling and getting them the help they need. You are in a position to not only see the risk but have the trust of the veteran in his or her time of crisis.

For fellow veterans, friends and other civilians, it also means being proactive to get the veteran the help they need. Don't assume someone else will act. Take the initiative.

When you see someone who is an active duty military personnel or a veteran, stop to thank him or her for their service. Ask how they are. Ask if they need anything. It's important to remember and help those who are and were willing to risk their life for you and your country.

The veterans committee has new inventory of R.E.D. t-shirts. We listened and have now added v-necks and long sleeves to our regular (crew neck, unisex) supply. 


Imperial Stormtroopers patrol the 2nd annual Santa Ana Elks Car & Motorcycle Show



### The Birth of the Elks: It All Started With The Jolly Corks

Since 1868, America's foremost fraternal organization has been recognized by the noble creature that is the symbol of the Order. The elk is a peaceful animal, but will rise in defense of its own in the face of a threat. The majestic creature is fleet of foot and keen of perception. A most fitting representation, the stately elk is, for a distinctively American, intensely patriotic, family-oriented organization subscribing to the cardinal principles of charity, justice, brotherly love and fidelity. The Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks of the United States of America has, indeed, fulfilled those principles and established a distinguished record of service and achievement since its founding on February 16, 1868.

But the roots of the association are admittedly shallow, predating the Order's official kickoff by only a few months. A small group of entertainers, wishing to continue their social gatherings on Sundays, when New York's blue laws prevented the opening of public establishments (taverns), began to meet regularly as the "Jolly Corks," a name derived from a bar trick introduced by the group's organizer. (See side column)

The moving spirit for the Jolly Corks was an Englishman named Charles Algernon Sidney Vivian (1842-1880). This son of a clergyman was a successful comic singer and dancer in the music halls of London. Vivian was a member of the Royal Antediluvian Order of Buffaloes in England ("RAOB"). On November 15, 1867, Vivian arrived in New York City to try his fortune. Vivian is credited with founding the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks of The United States of America.

Other actors and entertainers soon gravitated toward Vivian's magnetic personality.

While Jolly Corks meetings were held with regularity, apparently no form nor substance resulted, except for the adoption of a toast to members of the group not in attendance. This was the genesis of the eleven o'clock toast. The RAOB in England, the "Eleven O'clock symbol" on the Elks' emblem and, the Elks' Eleven O'clock Toast trace their history to the period prior to the Battle of Hastings in October of 1066. King William of Normandy instituted a curfew when all hearth fires were required to be banked at 11:00, thus ending all meetings. Accordingly, at the hour of 11:00 a toast was offered in remembrance of those who were gone.

Shortly before Christmas in 1867, only a few months after the

fellows began to meet, one of their number died, leaving his wife and children destitute. This event gave rise to the notion that, in addition to good fellowship, the Jolly Corks needed a more noble purpose in order to endure, and serving not only their own in need, but others as well, would be appropriate.

Two months later, with a statement of purpose, an impressive set of rituals, a symbol of strength and majesty and such other elaborate trappings that might be expected of a group of actors and musicians, the new fraternal order was launched. The growth and record of benevolence of the Elks is well-chronicled. Since its inception in 1868, the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks has grown to include nearly 1.2 million men and women in almost 2,200 communities.

Vivian died in Leadville, Colorado, March 20, 1880. At the time of his death he was the leader of a repertoire company performing in Leadville.

Why was the elk adopted as the symbol of the Order? The 15 surviving founders of the fraternity desired a readily identifiable creature of stature, indigenous to America. Eight members voted to adopt the elk, seven favored the buffalo. And, as they say, "The rest is ELKS history."

Today's Elks are in good company. Former Presidents Franklin Roosevelt, Gerald Ford, Harry Truman, and John Kennedy, former U.S. Senator Everett McKinley Dirksen of Illinois, and Senator Robert J. Dole of Kansas. Former Speakers of the House Tip O'Neill, Carl Albert, John McCormick and Sam Rayburn all belonged to the Elks. Entertainers Lawrence Welk, Will Rogers, Jack Benny and Andy Devine belonged, too. Devine was even Exalted Ruler of

San Fernando, California, Lodge. And Clint Eastwood is a member of Monterey, California, Lodge. From the sports world, the Order has counted among its members the likes of Vince Lombardi, Casey Stengel, Mickey Mantle, Whitey Ford, Robert Montgomery "Bobby" Knight, and Jim Finks.

The Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks is committed to the ideals of charity and patriotism. To that end, Elks have now disbursed over the Order's 132 years more than \$2,690,000,000.00 in cash, goods, and services to the nation's youth, its veterans, the disadvantaged and handicapped, and in support of patriotic and civic programs. In the 1998-99 fiscal year alone, the BPO Elks expended in such fashion over \$160 million, and the Order ranks as one of the largest private providers of college scholarships in the nation.

The legacy of Charles Vivian continues to this day. As long as there are those who need help, the Elks will be there to give aid and comfort.

# **How The Cork Trick Worked**

In 1922, William Phillips wrote the following account of the cork trick by which Vivian and his friends used to trick new acquaintances into buying them a drink. In a way, it was the first Elks initiation!

The prospective victim would be asked would he like to join the 'Cork,' and they being such a 'jolly' set of fellows, the candidate for admission to their circle readily assented. He would give his name to Vivian and pay a fee of fifty cents, which he placed in a little book he carried for that purpose.

Each one present then produced a cork and placed it in front of him upon the bar or table; a fresh cork (generally a champagne cork) was given to the candidate, and to him was then explained that the Imperial Cork (Vivian) would count to three whereupon each one present was to seize his cork, and 'the last one to lift his cork' paid for the drinks for the rest of the party.

At the count of three, the ones in on the trick would simply jump their open palms over their corks, but allowing them to remain on the bar or table; the candidate would eagerly seize his cork in haste, resolved not to be the last one to lift his cork. Much to his surprise, he'd find he was the only one who 'lifted his cork,' hence the 'last one.' So he was 'stuck for the drinks.'

Now that he had become 'one of us,' he had to always carry his cork in his pocket and whenever he met another Cork, if he was asked to produce his cork, he must do so under the penalty of buying the challenger a drink should he be unable to do so. That's truly a corker of a trick!




# Return of the Mariachi!
