


OC health department recommended we put a hold on our interactive salad bar until things calm down. We now include a complimentary garden salad or cup of soup with your dinner entrees.

There's a New Pig in Town!





While the small individual Purple Pigs are designed for coins, this one gladly takes dollars and checks! It's a reminder that every donation helps children walk, talk, see and play. If every single Elk in our association would donate just 10 cents, one thin dime a day, the piggy bank



would have over \$3.5 million for the year to help disabled children.

Presidents Warren G. Harding, Franklin D. Roosevelt, Harry S. Truman and John F. Kennedy were all Elks. Former President Gerald Ford belonged to Grand Rapids Lodge No. 48, where his father served two terms as Exalted Ruler.

as Presidents Day. However, it is really a day to celebrate only two presidents: Washington and Lincoln. In 1964 Congress passed the Uniform Holiday Monday Act, and while it did not officially change the name of the holiday, it did ensure it always fell on a Monday.

Another interesting bit of history and fact is how the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks is connected to our past presidents, five of whom were members of this great order.

Our 29th president, Warren G. Harding, was a member of the Marion, Ohio Lodge #32. President Harding was best remembered for establishing the budget and accounting branch of the federal government. He failed to complete his term in office, dying from a heart attack or stroke only two and half years after taking office.

Next in line was Franklin D. Roosevelt our 32nd president who served from 1933 until his death and who was a member of the Pough-keepsie, New York Lodge No. 275. The only president elected to the office four times, Roosevelt led the United States through two of the greatest crises of the 20th century: the Great Depression and World War II. In so doing, he greatly expanded the powers of the federal government through a series of programs and reforms known as the New Deal.

Our thirty-third president, Harry S. Truman was a member in Lodge #26 in Kansas City, Missouri. President Truman was a World War I veteran also and upon returning home in 1919, got married and started a business career. By 1922 he was launching his political career, which culminated with his acceptance of the position of vice-president on the Roosevelt-Truman ticket in 1944. 82 days later, Truman became president after FDR died suddenly from a cerebral hemorrhage. President Truman was the man who made the decision to end World War II when Japan refused to surrender, by dropping atomic bombs on two of their cities. He was also the first president to declare the United States would oppose communism, anywhere in the world.

The Boston, Massachusetts Lodge #10 can boast they had on their membership rolls President John F. Kennedy, our 35th president. One of our most popular presidents in history, he was the youngest president ever elected and seemed to bring new life to politics. President Kennedy dealt with Russia's Nikita Kruschev by challenging the building of the Berlin Wall in his famous Ich Bin Ein speech, declaring he was a Berliner to show support for West Berlin. He placed a blockade of ships to prevent Russia from delivering weapons and missiles to Cuba, a time known as the Cuban missile crisis. Ten months later he secured Russia's and Great Britain's leader's signatures on the Nuclear Test-Ban Treaty, bringing more stability and a lesser threat of nuclear war to the world. Kennedy also promised Americans we would be the first on the moon, which he never got to see due to his assassination in Dallas, Texas on November 22, 1963.

Our 38th president, Gerald R. Ford, was a member in good standing at the Grand Rapid, Michigan Lodge, #48 where his father served two terms as exalted ruler. President Ford is the only vice-president and president who was not elected to either office. He succeeded Spiro Agnew in 1973 for vice-president after Agnew resigned, selected by then President Richard Nixon. The very next year, Ford replaced President Nixon who was forced to resign due to the Watergate scandal. He survived two assassination attempts during his time in office. In his effort for reelection, he was the first incumbent president to agree to debate his challenger.

As we celebrate President's Day this month, remember we as Elks, have our own connection to the history of our nation's leaders. We have had Elk members lead our great nation and who knows, maybe we will again one day!

Let me give you a little bit of background: Back in 1987, I was the assistant commissioner for the City of Santa Ana AYSO soccer and held a coach position also. I reached out to Orangewood to see if any of their children wanted to join my team. Well, I was thrilled to get three children, a brother and sister and one little boy who is deaf on my Bad Bats team.

When the soccer season was over, I reached out to Orangewood again to see if I could do something more with the children. It was Christmas time and I was able to bring supplies to make ornaments with the kids. It was so nice to see their little smiles, it filled my heart with joy.

Last year, I was advised that they have about 15 to 20 new children arrive every month. I proposed giving blankets to the kids as they arrive. A blanket was something that they could call their own, hold tight and cry with while sharing their darkest secrets. But most of all, its their's to keep.

I can only imagine the excitement when they get these new blankets. Thank you Elks and the football committee for your kind donation!

First and foremost, I'd like to express my sincere thanks for your unwavering commitment for the Red Cross blood program partnership at your Elks Lodge in Santa Ana. Your partnership has made a significant impact for hospital patients in our community and beyond. We're truly grateful for your dedication and hope to have your continued support in 2024.

As you may know, blood shortages continue to be a pressing concern. The Red Cross national blood supply has fallen by about 25% since early August, as donor turnout dropped on the heels of one of the busiest travel seasons on record, back-to-school activities and an already active hurricane season.

Blood product distributions to hospitals are outpacing the number of blood donations coming in, and distributions of some of the most needed blood types to hospitals have been reduced in recent weeks. The Red Cross is working with hospitals around—theclock to meet the blood needs of patients, but we can't do it alone. The Elk's lifesaving blood drives help ensure a stable blood supply is available for patients requiring transfusions and emergency medical care.


Steely Dan Tribute Band to Perform at Lodge February 23


