Come meet Percy as welcome Cathy P., Denise B., and Linda F. to our Purple Pig he dons his purple lei! Committee!

I am a 1st/2nd grade school teacher with 28 years of experience. Last year, I was fortunate to have 4 autistic students in my classroom with their full time aides for part of the school day. Those children were sweet and made my day! I also volunteer for the Special Olympics of Southern California helping with bowling, track, and golf events. Volunteering with SOSC is so rewarding! I have a special place in my heart reserved for children with disabilities and that is why the California Hawaii Elks Major Project, the Purple Pig, is dear to me.

Our 2024 theme child, Rudy Augustus, is from Ridgrecrest, California. He was born March, 2023 with positive prenatal screening for Down syndrome. Rudy went into respiratory failure an hour after birth and spent 26 days in the NICU diagnosed with 2 heart defects, low muscle tone, feeding challenges and received blood transfusions. Thanks to having all his in-home therapy in place, with support from specialists at Children's Hospital of Orange County (CHOC), Rudy is thriving. Thanks to your donations, included in Rudy's extraordinary therapy team is California-Hawaii Elks Major Project (CHEMPI) is Michelle Bychek who travels over an hour each way to provide Rudy with feeding therapy as well as speech therapy.

Fast forward one year and Rudy is thriving! He is learning to swallow, reducing the chance that food could go into his lungs rather than his stomach. Rudy is also receiving speech pathology services that encourage him to keep his lips closed and his tongue in a good position inside his mouth; tools that will give him a head start when speaking. Although you have not met Rudy, please know that he appreciates everything your donations are doing for him!

The Purple Pig committee ran a Purple Pig Naming contest at one of our trivia nights. We had 15 entries and without knowing the names of the entrants, the committee chose the name, Percy, submitted by Jan Woolford! Congratulations

August 10th is the lodge's birthday celebrating Aloha



### VETERANS CORNER

As we move into August, it's hard to believe that 2024 is moving so quickly.

First of all, I'm happy to say that our Veterans Committee has received the Focus Grant. This will allow us to help Patriots for Paws, which is an organization to help any veteran that need household items for their home. (furniture, appliances, kitchen ware etc) This will also enable us to help with 75-80 Thanksgiving dinners that families can take home to share with their friends, families, and loved ones.

Though 'National Hire a Veteran Day' was July 25, it's good to remember that every day is a good day to hire a veteran. The day was established in 2017 by Marine Corps veteran Dan Caporale to recognize the skills and experience veterans bring to the workplace, and to encourage employers to hire them. It also aims to raise awareness of the importance of supporting veterans as they transition to civilian life.



There are many days in August dedicated to celebrating different branches of the U.S. Military. I'm happy to highlight days of recognition

of our warriors and veterans, such as, National Coast Guard Day, Purple Heart Day, National Airborne Day, and Marine Corps Reserve Birthday.

The first national holiday of the month, August 4th, is dedicated as National Coast Guard Day. On this day in 1790, the US Coast Guard was founded as the Revenue Marine by then-Secretary of the Treasury, Alexander Hamilton. The Coast Guard received its present name through an act of Congress signed into law by

President Woodrow Wilson on January 28, 1915. This act merged the Revenue Cutter Service with the U.S. Lifewith a single maritime service dedicated to saving life at sea and enforcing the nation's maritime laws.



August 7th is Purple Heart Day. The Purple Heart was first created on August 7, 1782 by the Commander-In-Chief of the Continental Army, General George Washington. Then known as the Badge of Military Merit, it was awarded to three Revolutionary soldiers in 1783. It wasn't until 1932 that the metal was revived on the bicentennial anniversary of George Washington's birth. The Purple Heart is a U.S. military decoration awarded in the name of the President to those wounded or killed while serving on or after April 5, 1917. It is the oldest military award still given to U.S. military members.



National Airborne Day is recognized every year on August 16th. In 2002, President George W. Bush created the holiday commemorating the first official Army parachute jump on August 16, 1940. The history of airborne forc-

es began after World War I, when Brigadier General William Mitchell first conceived the idea of parachuting Saving Service and provided the nation troops into combat. During World War II, airborne tactics were critical to the success of important missions including the D-Day invasion and the Battle of the Bulge. Airborne tactics remain a vital role in military combat missions today.



August 29th is the Marine Corps Reserve Birthday. The mission of the Marine Corps Reserve is to

augment and reinforce active Marine forces in time of war, national emergency or contingency operations, to provide personnel and operational tempo relief for the active forces in peacetime, and to serve the community. It was established when Congress passed the Naval Appropriations Act on August 29, 1916.

I believe it's significant to remember those who have given their life or were willing to give their life to protect our country. It's important to stop and thank a veteran, and if you see one living on the street, ask if they need help. Sometimes they just want someone to listen. It's not difficult to make someone feel valued, treated with respect or given a bite to eat, a warm blanket.

I know this article will mainly be of interest to new or newer members, but who knows, maybe some old timers will learn something too!


