What a year! We have so much to be grateful for in this country and I'm looking forward to a great 2025.

In December, our committee was honored to receive 33 applications for the most valuable student. Let me tell you, reading and judging these applications is anything but easy! These young people are among the brightest and best of students in our area. They have interesting and creative ideas, and many of them will be studying areas of study that did not exist when we were all going to university. So, to choose the top students to advance to district judging was extremely challenging!

On January 4, the district judging takes place, our lodge will host 30 committee member judges from across our district. It's an all-day event with the judges carefully choosing the students who would advance to state and national judging, with the scholarship value increasing at each level. I wish all those students well as their applications move up in the judging. The award winners for our lodge and service area will be announced in an open meeting on March 4, 2025.

There is still time for those students in your life to apply for these scholarships.

• Santa Ana Elks #794 Scholarships: six scholarships ranging from \$1000 to \$5000 are available for our own Santa Ana Elks, children, grand-children or step-children of Elks, that are high school seniors or in college. Applications are due 1/17/25.

• Monday Night Football Athletic Scholarship: at least six scholarships available ranging \$500-\$2,000 for scholar athletes in Santa Ana, Tustin and Irvine. Applications are due 2/1/25.

• Lenz Scholarship: One last scholarship of \$2,000 is available from this legacy scholarship. Applicants should be a high school senior and a child, grandchild or stepchild of an Elks member. Applications are due 1/24/25.

• Set up a complete food pantry at Heroes Landing (food/shelving).


• Thanksgiving meals for veterans at Patriots and Paws (80 bags with enough food to feed family of 8-10 with 96 frozen turkeys)


• Wreaths Across America (laid 850 wreaths on veterans gravesites)
