

### **I Pledge Allegiance**

### The Story behind the Lodge Room Flag

I would be willing to bet big money that if I asked 1,000 members of our lodge who a certain person was, I could count on one hand how many would know him.

If you joined our lodge as a member anytime after September of 2019, you have been in our lodge room at least once when you were initiated. Anyone just feel a tinge of guilt if that's you? Sorry, let me stay on topic.

As I'm sure most if not all of you know, our lodge opened in June of 2019. As with any new "home", there is always the task of decorating it. Over the past five years, we've done a nice job of making it feel like a lodge and our "home". One of those items is the American flag that hangs on the wall in our lodge room behind the exalted ruler station. It's a nice big flag in a nice, basic frame. The focal point of our lodge when you sit anywhere in the room.

Let's go back to March of 2019. My stepdaughter, Neli, was playing softball for Syracuse University. Her dad, Scott, and my wife Sharon were all back in New York to watch her play. In between games we would seek out Elks lodges. On this trip, we traveled to Rome, New York and visited Elks Lodge #96. It was built around 1848 and is on both the State of New York and national registries of historical buildings. As we finished up the tour, we were given what was obviously a star from a retired U.S. flag, as a souvenir. We asked if it was from a flag at their lodge and we were told no, it

was from a retired flag from a local grave site there in town. The name on the grave? Francis Bellamy.

So now I ask all of our approximately 1,800 members (assuming not everyone will read this), do you know who Francis Bellamy is? He was none other than the man who wrote our Pledge of Allegiance. He was a Baptist minister as a young man and his travels to promote his faith and be of service in the community, brought him to Massachusetts. In 1891, he was hired at the patriotic circular/magazine, Youth's Companion. A few years earlier, Youth's Companion had initiated a campaign to sell U.S. flags to public schools around the country. Francis penned the pledge as a part of the promotion.


The original version was this: "I pledge Allegiance to my Flag and to the Republic for which it stands, one Nation indivisible, with Liberty and Justice for all". Bellamy's original salute, included

extending your arm out toward the flag, palm up.

That salute was changed to what we know now of placing our hands over hearts in WW II, mainly because it too closely resembled the Nazi salute of Hitler's Germany. Later in 1954, to offset a perceived threat of secular communism, President Eisenhower added the words, "under God", giving us our current version.

On our tour, when we found out where those stars came from, we mentioned how great it would be to have a flag that had flown over the gravesite of the author of our pledge of allegiance for our new lodge. That was left hanging, with nary a yea, nay or maybe. Then in September, we received a package in the mail and there was the flag with a note from the Rome Elks Lodge that it had flown over the gravesite of Francis Bellamy.

The next time you take someone on a tour or are in the lodge, ask someone if they know about the flag. It's always fun to see how they react when they find out where it came from.

# **Contest Announced for New Lodge Pin Design**

The second year after I joined the Elks, I went to orientations to meet the new candidates. Every now and then, I would be asked, "What do you like about the Elks?" I would respond, "It is getting to visit other lodges."

That still holds true today. There are a lot of reasons to enjoy being an Elk: the camaraderie, the volunteering opportunities, being an officer, and of course, visiting other lodges. I have conservatively been to over 350 lodges in my merry travels.

One of the first questions I ask when visiting other lodges, after going on a tour of their lodge, is, "Do you have a lodge pin?" If they do, I will buy one. Many times they'll give me one and respond with, "Do you have one to share?" Luckily, I usually do, as I bought a bunch a few years back.

My stash is now running dry. Thus, the reason for this article. We have run out of lodge pins. Instead of producing more of the old pin, it is time to create a new lodge pin that reflects our current lodge.

The current lodge pin has a likeness to our current CHEA pin, without the Hawaiian flag. There are a few subtle differences, but they are similar. I went to the house committee and proposed a design contest for a new lodge pin that's unique to our lodge.

They approved the idea and tasked me with organizing a contest to select a new pin; something we can be proud to have available for current members and to visiting Elks. Let's get started and make this happen.

New pin design process:

- 1. The deadline for current Elks members to submit a design for a pin is December 10, 2024.
- 2. A small committee of non-participating Elks members will select three pins from those submitted. These will be pins they believe best represent our Lodge.
- 3. Those chosen will be published on our web site and social media for review by our members.
- 4. A vote on the floor of the lodge will be held at the February 18 lodge meeting to select a new lodge pin.
- 5. The designer of the winning pin will receive their 2025-2026 dues paid.


I would like to thank all who donated time and money. We had around 45 volunteers stuffing backpacks both days. It was a huge job this year and you did an amazing job!




